



College Revision Rooms

Location

The College has 8 rooms with tables and chairs that students are encouraged to use for revision (revision rooms). 4 rooms are on the first floor; 4 extra rooms are located on the second floor. Each of these rooms contains 3 tables with 4 chairs each, ie 12 seats per room. In addition, the two College libraries can be used as study rooms as well as consultation rooms.

Capacity

Together, the 8 study rooms and two libraries provide 124 places for reading and writing. These are more than sufficient for the current requirements of the College (120 students, a good number of which use their room for revision). Accordingly, students do not need (and should not use) other rooms outside their individual rooms, therevision rooms and the two libraries for study.

Access

To avoid overcrowding, however, the use of revision rooms is reserved for members of the College. External guests may use the College libraries, if supervised by a member of the College.

Rules

The rules applying to the use of revision rooms are similar to the ones that regulate the use of College libraries. In particular:

- It is forbidden to move tables and chairs around or to bring additional tables or desks into the libraries or revision rooms. Similarly, it is forbidden to replace the chairs present in libraries or revision rooms with chairs used in other parts of the College, for example in the breakfast room.
- Noise, loud talking or any other inappropriate behaviour are prohibited.
- Consumption of alcoholic beverages and smoking is forbidden.
- Mobile phones may only be used in 'silent mode' setting.
- Furniture must not be damaged or moved from its initial location.
- Tables must be left clear of objects and clean at the end of a study session. Students must not leave books or lecture notes in order to prevent theft or accidental loss of study material.
